With the support of núna (now), Intermedia artist Freya Björg Olafson presents the world premiere of HYPER_. This new work exploits the dimensionality of the performers body in relationship to the immersive screen, moving seamlessly between 3D and 2D representations of corporeality. HYPER_ inherently becomes a site for expanded choreography where bodies and disembodied technology mix. The performers physique is dissected and transformed, disappearing and merging with the stage and screen. Animated by a series of transformations, layered and colorful, the body becomes a dreamscape. HYPER_ deploys an intriguing combination of Lo and Hi technology to create stunning illusions and features lighting design by Hugh Conacher.

Olafson states 'Our era of ceaseless copying and remixing is an omen for our cultural crisis of authenticity'. In her work we see that we have arrived at the age of doubt and are no longer sure about anything, including the authenticity of our own experience. Consequently 'I doubt therefore I am' has become the inescapable narrative of our time. As a result the distinction between the real and the fake has become increasingly obliterated. Freya's work has evolved from a focus on the mantra 'I post therefore I am' in AVATAR, to her concern in HYPER with perpetual cultural uncertainty & questioning 'I doubt, therefore I am' - 'Dubito, ergo sum'.

Olafson's most recent award winning work AVATAR achieved international success, touring across seven provinces, four states, three cities in Ecuador, as well as various showings across six countries in Europe. Her work has been recognized for its innovation, interdisciplinarity, evocative imagery, dark humour and was called "Incontournable (Not to be missed)" by Le Devoir in Montréal - Don't miss it, book your tickets!



The Dance Current

Freya Björg Olafson is an intermedia artist who works with video, audio, painting and performance. Her creations have been presented and exhibited internationally at venues such as SECCA ~ SouthEastern Center for Contemporary Art (North Carolina), OchoYmedio / Alas de la Danza (Quito, Guayaquil and Manta in Ecuador), The National Arts Center (Ottawa), High Performance Rodeo (Calgary), Tangente – Laboratoire des Movements Contemporains (Montreal), Sequences Real Time

Media Arts Festival (Iceland) and Medea Electronic / Onassis Cultural Center (Athens, Greece). Freya's work has toured extensively. Her solo performance AVATAR received the 'Buddies In Bad Times Vanguard Award' at the Summerworks Theatre Festival in Toronto and toured across 7 provinces in Canada, 4 states in the USA, three cities in Ecuador, Reykjavík, Iceland as well as various excerpts were shown across Europe. Five years after the premiere, AVATAR is still on the road, heading to Diskurs Festival in Giessen, Germany October 9 – 13, 2013. Freya's video work has screened in festivals across the globe with upcoming dates in Belgium and Brazil. To develop her projects Freya engages in residencies most recently through EMPAC - Experimental Media & Performing Arts Center (Troy, New York), Atlantic Center for the Arts (Florida), Medea Electronique (Greece), Plug In ICA (Summer Institute) and Studio 303 (Montréal).

As performer and creator, Freya blends 6 years classical training in the Professional Program of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet with the contemporary facility achieved through her completion of the Bachelor of Arts Honors degree in dance from Winnipeg's School of Contemporary Dancers in affiliation with the University of Winnipeg. She combines her finesse in movement with the directness of her performance art, video and theory studies from the University of Manitoba School of Art and her subsequent completion of a Master of Fine Arts Degree in New Media from the Transart Institute / Donau Universitat in Krems, Austria. As an independent performer Freya has worked with Winnipeg's Contemporary Dancers, Trip Dance Company, Adhere & Deny Theatre Company, Gearshifiting Performance Works, as well as choreographers Stephanie Ballard, D-Anne Kuby, Jennifer Essex, and Natasha Torres-Garner.

Outside of creating her own work and performing in the work of others Freya is actively involved in the community in curating. She is a member of the curatorial committee for the núna (now) festival since 2007. Freya is active on the board of Video Pool Media Arts Center and a member of ISPA – International Society for Performing Arts through the Canada Council Legacy Program. Freya is a research collaborator with the newly established Canadian Consortium for Performance and Politics in the Americas led by Peter Kulchyski (University of Manitoba). In Fall 2013 Freya looks forward to being an Associate Artist in residence at Atlantic Center for the Arts in a mentored residency with Charles Atlas, well known for his longstanding collaborations with the legendary American choreographer Merce Cunningham. As well she will be researching the work of Lazlo Moholy-Nagy at the Bauhaus Archiv in Berlin in order to create a new work for the exhibition 'Sensing the Future: Moholy-Nagy, Media & The Arts', curated by Dr. Oliver I.A. Botar which will premiere at the Plug In ICA in Winnipeg in March 2014. www.freyaolafson.com

HUGH CONACHER Winnipeg, Manitoba



Hugh has collaborated with choreographers, dance companies and theatres across Canada and around the world for over 30 years. His work in Canada has been seen with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, Theatre Calgary, National Arts Centre, Gearshifting Performance Works and the Griffin Trio. Hugh has expanded his process beyond traditional lighting design to include various forms of interactive media and photography, as seen in Hybrid Human at the Winnipeg Art Gallery, Jolene Bailie's Sensory Life, Infinite World, Freya Olafson's Avatar and Theatre Project's North Main Gothic, for which he designed the set, media and lighting.
